Fake Thugs

In February 2018 the retiring head of UK Counter Terrorism (Assistant Commissioner Sir Mark ROWLEY) warned of a growing domestic "white supremacist" terrorism threat: "I can tell you that over the same period [since the Islamic terrorist attack in Westminster] police have been able to prevent a further four extreme, right wing inspired plots in the UK ... it is important we make these figures public in order to illustrate the growth of right-wing extremism ... For the first time we have a home-grown proscribed white supremacist, neo-Nazi terror group, which seeks to plan attacks and build international networks." 123

The "neo-Nazi terror group" is (or, rather, was) National Action.

Just one month after Sir Mark ROWLEY's remarks an article titled 'The Obscure Neo-Nazi Forum Linked to a Wave of Terror', by journalist James POULTER, was published by VICE (UK) Magazine. Included within that VICE article was the following observation: "IronMarch.org was not the kind of website to hang out on if you knew what was good for you. A swastika-plastered forum which took its users on a shared journey of extreme radicalization, it kick-started an international wave of Nazi terror. Users of IronMarch.org have attempted a mall shooting; murdered two young men; attempted to hack a Sikh dentist with a machete; and have been found to be in possession of illegal weapons and material to make bombs, among other crimes." ⁴

That article became the 'go-to' source for information, on *IronMarch.org*, for all mainstream journalists and 'anti-extremism' groups – and is therefore listed as the primary source, as reference (1) on Wikipedia.

For reasons not given within his article, James POULTER identified a Russian named Alexander SLAVROS as "one of the founders" of IronMarch.org. Which begs the question – what was the proof (or, indeed, even reliable evidence) for that particular claim? Notably, he did not name any other "founders". James POULTER lists a particular British person, Benjamin RAYMOND, as "one of the founders of National Action", but only describes RAYMOND as an IronMarch.org "administrator". ⁵

Whilst most of those using the IronMarch.org forum used a unique and anonymous name for their account (such as 'Woman in Black', or 'Ritz'), Alexander SLAVROS used his very Russian sounding/appearing name – a name that would have pointed directly to his other social media accounts (including his slavros.org, and his DeviantArt.com accounts). He even put links to both his slavros.org and IronMarch.org sites on his DeviantArt.com pages. This was very, very strange.

On the basis of the circumstances, the context, and the research findings described within this report, it is entirely reasonable to conclude that it was Benjamin RAYMOND (alias NOYLES) who provided VICE (UK) with the information that Alexander SLAVROS was a founder of the IronMarch.org forum.

Eighteen months later, on the 6th November 2019, the membership details of the IronMarch.org forum (including user account names, passwords, email addresses, IP addresses and posted comments) were 'leaked' onto the Internet. This prompted considerable interest (and research) by the Internet community – resulting in the 'outing' of those individuals who could be purportedly identified on the basis of that 'leaked' information. This occurred more than eight years after the IronMarch.org had been first launched.

On two consecutive days, starting on the 6th November 2019, Benjamin RAYMOND posted tweets in which he made various remarks concerning the 'leaked' IronMarch.org forum – including this, on the 7th November: "My problem child – the gift that keeps on giving. Oh boy, nostalgia time!" Most significantly, that particular comment included RAYMOND's linking to a Twitter post by a US-based, and inexplicably secretive, anti-Russia propaganda organization PROPORNOT. Most notable is RAYMOND's use of the phrase "My problem child" rather than "Our problem child" – as possibly an unintended admission, by him, of his sole role in the origination and founding of the neo-Nazi IronMarch.org forum.

PROPORNOT has extraordinary similarities to UK-based BELLINGCAT. Notably, PROPORNOT appears to have been the originator of the story that: (1) the Russian Alexander SLAVROV was the sole founder of IronMarch.org; (2) that his real name was Alisher MUKHITDINOV; and (3) that (allegedly) he had had close personal connections to the upper echelon of the Russian political establishment. No evidence is given to back up those assertions. Instead of which, people are merely told (in effect) that the information is 'in the public domain' – and they (you) should therefore go find it themselves (yourself). Therefore, the way in which PROPORNOT has striven to identify the 'ownership' of that IronMarch.org forum has to be considered as utterly unconvincing. This appears to follow a deliberate, obfuscating agenda. ^{6 7}

What has to be important, therefore, is identifying and confirming who had actually originated IronMarch.org – and who was effectively in charge of, and was running, that very notorious operation.

There is therefore a major problem here. This relates to an independent examination of the way in which the neo-Nazi National Action group and the IronMarch.org forum were created, and for which purpose they were actually intended to serve. It is of particular interest to see the efforts, by UK State agencies and by mainstream media, to completely avoid the linking of the founding of the UK-based neo-Nazi group National Action, to the founding of IronMarg.org forum, some three years previously. Which rather begs the question – why would such enquiries be considered as either 'off-limits' or of 'no public interest'?

The authenticity of the IronMarch.org forum and National Action organizations – in regard to their true original purpose – is never questioned by mainstream corporate media, or by the State-endorsed organizations investigating into, and reporting upon, such emerging and bizarre entities. Indeed, mainstream media have unquestionably accepted Benjamin RAYMOND's own 'performativity' narrative. They want us, and expect us, to accept RAYMOND (the National Action founder) as a 'trusted source'.

In fact an examination of the evidence points very firmly toward IronMarch.org having been RAYMOND's own personal project. This is backed up by the time-lines – from the creation and registration of (his) integralistparty.zzl.org and the IronMarch.org forum, together with the particular contents of both websites. It is therefore such research – as that described within this report – that can lead down some rather strange and perplexing paths. And there is often (to be found) an important historical context.

It was in the first six months of 2007 that a person using the name Tom STANWELL became a featured contributor to Welf HERFURTH's nationalist blog in Australia – a blog that was also listed on Benjamin RAYMOND's own (somewhat later) UK blog. And, indeed, the content of STANWELL's work could well be seen as a blueprint for the recreation of the previous (1980s/1990s) disciplinarian, fascist group National Action (Australia) into a future, new UK context, some 6 years later (i.e. in late 2013). 8 9 Notably *Tom STANWELL* only ever had a presence (under that obviously bogus identity) during the first half of 2007.

Therefore, the context for this was launch in Australia, in 1982, of the bogus, anti-Semitic neo-Fascist, neo-Nazi group National Action (Australia). This followed a 'founding meeting' of that particular extremeright group between 3 individuals: David GREASON, plus two other unnamed persons. ^{10 11} Notably, David GREASON had, along with the rest of his family, emigrated from Manchester when aged eight, he appears to have returned (briefly) to the UK in the late 1970s to be involved in fomenting confrontations between the National Front (NF) and the newly created Anti-Nazi League (ANL). ^{12 13 14 1516 17}

There is also this interesting observation, from an independent source: "It may be significant that [Ray] Hill's task [an operative for the UK-based Searchlight/Hope Not HATE organization] and [David] Greason's for the last 11 years [i.e. from 1987 to 1998] has been to 'prove' that all Nationalists – patriotic-conservative organisations are somehow 'Nazi'." ¹⁸

GLEASON was subsequently connected to the International Socialist Organization (ISO, an offspring of the UK Socialist Workers Party), to The Age newspaper, and to the AIJC and the Australia Israel Review.

The bogus National Action (Australia) group is therefore seen to have been created with a particular purpose of stopping the emergence of the National Anarchist Movement (NAM) in Australia – to give supposed substance to the narrative that the NAM was a pro-fascist/neo-Nazi movement, despite the fact that such fascist/racist ideologies were clearly the antithesis of what NAM was attempting to advance. ¹⁹

Given Benjamin RAYMOND's lies regarding his immigration into the UK, and his distinct Australian accent (see later) – and the extraordinary parallel's between the important purpose of the bogus National Action (Australia) to destroy NAM in Australia, and that of the later National Action (UK) to destroy Generation Identity in the UK – this historical context has to be included as an important part of this analysis.

In the UK, on the 1st August 2008, Benjamin RAYMOND registered a website for the 'Integralist Party'. ²⁰ However, over its subsequent 8-year online history, the 'Integralist Party' never appears to have operated as a *bona fide* political party. ²¹ Indeed, its primary purpose only ever appears to have been as a tool used to solicit details of people, resident within the UK, who were holding an interest in neo-fascist ideology.

It was from December 2008 – and whilst enjoying his time as a student at Essex University – that Benjamin RAYMOND (then aged 19) ran a blog, under the name 'Benjamin NOYLES'.

From approximately March 2009 until May 2011 Benjamin RAYMOND was the Deputy Party Leader of the Integralist Party, under Party Leader Robert STEAD. There were six other members of the party committee. The party website was integralist.org. However the whole thing fell apart – reportedly as a result of an attempt by RAYMOND to take over both the party and the website. ²²

On the 2nd July 2010 Benjamin RAYMOND joined an online International Third Positionist Federation forum (ITPF). ²³ Notably a person named Alexander SLAVROS also became a member of that forum some 6 weeks later (on the 15th August 2010). And they both subsequently became forum administrators.

Following his graduation from Essex University, Benjamin RAYMOND opened a number of neo-Fascist websites and blogs – including the website integralistparty.zzl.org, used for the promotion of the neo-fascist Integralist Party of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (IPGBNI). The IPBGNI website is therefore shown as having been active from the 15th July 2011. As we will see, this would not be the only time that Benjamin RAYMOND endeavored to maliciously seize control of a political organization and its website.

Benjamin RAYMOND's IPGBNI website, on it's inaugural day of the 15th July 2011, included a direct reference (in domain name and in symbolism/artwork) to a putative IronMarch.org forum website. This was despite that particular website (IronMarch.org) not being registered until 11 weeks later (on the 1st October 2011) – with it's first presence on the Internet not recorded until two days later (on the 3rd October 2011).

In August 2011 Benjamin RAYMOND posted on his 'Britain Awake' blog his satisfaction that the "little cunt" – a Scottish undergraduate student – had been convicted and expelled from St. Andrews University for protesting the actions of the Israeli Government against the Palestinian people. ²⁴ In his post RAYMOND included a link to The JEWISH JOURNAL – presumably a source RAYMOND subscribed to. ²⁵ It would appear that RAYMOND was so outraged at the student's opposition to Israel's (and to the IDF's, especially) behaviour within the Occupied Territories – seeing it as anti-Semitism - that he threw all caution aside and posted his reaction without due caution.

The online posts by Alexander SLAVROS, from October 2011 and onwards, are in perfect colloquial English – firmly pointing to the source being a natural, native English speaker (i.e. not a Russian). ²⁶

Obviously the iconic image for IronMarch.org – embedded within the home page of RAYMOND's IPGBNI website – doesn't hyper-link to the IronMatch.org forum website (which, of course, didn't exist at that time). Instead of which, it linked to another 'manifesto' webpage on the IPGBNI website. ²⁷

However it is noted that particular 'manifesto' page was <u>never</u> uploaded to the IPGNI website. It therefore seems it was originally intended to be a temporary 'placeholder' for the forthcoming IronMarch.org 'manifesto' (i.e. rules for new members), then under construction by Benjamin RAYMOND. Benjamin RAYMOND would later boast that it was he, himself, who had written the IronMarch.org 'manifesto'. ²⁸

Toward the end of 2011 RAYMOND's IronMarch.org forum became a replacement for SLAVROS's ITPF forum. However things did no go well: "I was at first glad to see the ITPF had a successor. But soon I realized these guys were a different breed from the old forum. I was a respected member of the old site, but a "sperg" here. We used to have a good deal of quality member. I don't think many of them left." ²⁹

One of the earliest contributors to the IronMarch.org forum (within just a few weeks of its launch, in October 2011) was a 16-year-old schoolboy named Alex DAVIES. It was undoubtedly DAVIES's involvement in IronMarch.org that resulted in his being referred to the UK State-run anti-radicalization PREVENT programme, sometime toward the end of that same year. ³⁰

The UK police and security agencies would have been monitoring the IronMarch.org forum from its very inception. Those State agencies will have known the real identities of those persons joining, and posting comment to, that site – and they will also have known the identity of the particular individual who had set up that particular Internet forum (i.e. Benjamin RAYMOND). Which rather begs the question (given the site's extreme content) – why didn't the UK State ever act to have IronMarch.org closed down? ³¹

A particular matter that has greatly alarmed the UK State has been the emergence and the growth of a popular, youth-orientated, 'European identity' movement, over the last ten years. This movement appears to have had its roots in Génération Identitaire, started in France in 2002. It subsequently gained traction in various forms, for example: European Traditionalism; This Is Europa; European Awakening; Europa Rising; Generation Europa; and most especially Generation Identity (GI). And this movement contained a common, major concern, defined as 'The Great Replacement'. ³²

In February 2013 yet another online post by Alexander SLAVROS appeared – and yet again in perfect colloquial English (and therefore, presumably, the product of a native English speaker). ³³

On the 15th May 2013 an English translation of a 'manifesto' by the founder of Génération Identitaire, Markus WILLINGER, titled 'Generation Identity: A Declaration of War Against the 68-ers', was published by ARKTOS Press. A week later a Stop White Genocide YouTube channel was created. This was followed the same year by other published articles following much the same 'European Identity' theme. ³⁴ ³⁵

People who genuinely protested the potential loss of their homelands, lives and livelihoods had to be portrayed as fascists, 'white supremacists', and neo-Nazis. Most noticeably, the overtly fascist, neo-Nazi *National Action* was founded by Benjamin RAYMOND, together with the UK State's PREVENT-mentored Alex DAVIES, in late September 2013 – i.e. a mere 4 months after Generation Identity (*Génération Identitaire* GI) first emerged within the UK. ³⁶

The emergence of Generation Identity within the UK, and its subsequent growth in popular support and activism, resulted in efforts by the UK State and by State-supported groups to "discredit, destabilize and destroy" it – including by covert means involving the creation and use of bogus neo-Nazi associations.

Sometime between the 8th July and the 1st September 2013 the DeviantArt.com account of Alexander SLAVROS was hacked and up-loaded with some very, very nasty neo-Nazi content (content that will have been a serious crime in Russia, and which normally leads to culprits being arrested, charged and imprisoned). Coincidently, this occurred just a few weeks prior to the website of National Action (in the UK) being founded, first registered, and launched, by Benjamin RAYMOND and the (UK State's PREVENTmentored) Alex DAVIES – and which, undoubtedly, enabled close connections developing between *National Action* members and the IronMarch.org forum members from (at least) that time. ^{37 38}

My research points to National Action having been formed in September 2013 – i.e. approximately (just) four months after GI was first introduced into the UK. ³⁹ Of particular note (in that regard) are these comments by the leader of *National Action* (Benjamin RAYMOND) posted on a right-wing forum: "First, National Action was never anything to do with the New Right or the 'intellectual' counter currents talk shop.

It is self-organized and self funded by fascists with no association with the wider movement or this gay 'dark enlightenment' thing. We can say this because we were founded in violent opposition to the prospect of a poorly executed British 'generation identity' clone."

RAYMOND went on to expound that purpose (of the formation of *National Action*): "Secondly the most exceptional care was taken to warn against any attempt to 'copy' similar youth groups in Europe." 40 41

It is especially interesting (and is seen as very significant) that the phrase "we were founded" was used, rather than "we founded". It is a 'slip of the tongue' that reveals something rather interesting – that there was a 'higher authority' involved in the creation of National Action (for the purpose of attacking GI). ⁴² This appears to have been a major blunder by one of the (appointed) leaders of National Action.

As we will see, the "violent opposition" to GI was to be achieved by proxy – by inciting hate and violence against GI members and GI events, by expropriating GI campaign issues (especially against State-imposed mass immigration, and multiculturalism) as forms of neo-Nazi ideological 'activism'.

In September 2015, BBC TV published a 10-minute video interview with Benjamin RAYMOND. ⁴³ The purpose was clearly to give credence as to the *bona-fide* nature of RAYMOND and *National Action* – and presumably to help promote that group's purported ideological beliefs and it's 'direct action' intentions. ⁴⁴

An analysis of the broadcast – and, in particular, the conversations between Benjamin RAYMOND and BBC reporter Catrin NYE – is rather revealing. ⁴⁵ In that interview he states he was "born in Bognor Regis and I have lived there all my life". ⁴⁶ When pressed by NYE, he refused to discuss his upbringing, saying only: "I have no parents". He clearly didn't want to discuss such matters. However, RAYMOND is also recorded as saying, in a radio (podcast) interview with Greg JOHNSON of Counter Currents Publishing, in February 2016 (i.e. just 5 months later), that: "I spent the first few years of my life in Spain". ⁴⁷

Benjamin RAYMOND couldn't have been in two places at once. So – why the deception? However, on listening to Benjamin RAYMOND, a pronounced Australian accent is again very apparent. 48

In October 2015 a rather ludicrous piece of literature - purportedly co-authored by Alexander SLAVROS

and a Canadian neo-Nazi – was published. ⁴⁹ Written in very poor, ungrammatical English, it was a fictional story used to promote neo-fascism, racism and (most especially) anti-Semitism. The English used was completely different to the perfect colloquial English, routinely used by Alexander SLAVROS, some 3 years earlier, in his online posts (for example on his Deviantart.com account – see earlier).

The assessment is that this was a rather clumsy attempt to redress that previous mistake – to produce 'evidence' to ensure people would not suspect that SLAVROS was not only not Russian, but was, in fact, a native English speaker.

In early 2016 members of National Action performed the horrifically sick stunt of photographing themselves doing Nazi salutes and displaying their neo-Nazi flag, in (what they, themselves, referred to as) the "killing room" at the Buchenwald Nazi death camp in Germany. This was the room in which, during WW2, the Nazi SS had most cruelly hung 1,100 men, women and children – to die by slow strangulation. ⁵⁰ Obviously, National Action attracted vile people, with especially nasty and perverted beliefs – and who acted out such characteristics through very sickening behaviour. The especially sick handwritten comment, added to that picture, has been identified as that of Benjamin RAYMOND (see attached scans).

On the 29th November 2016 James POULTER, writing for VICE (UK),, expressed his opposition to the UK Government banning National Action, saying it would be "a waste of time" and would be ineffective. ⁵¹

On the 16th December 2016 the Home Office belatedly announced that the neo-Nazi *National Action* had been proscribed as a terrorist group – describing that group as "a racist, anti-Semitic, and homophobic organization which stirs up hatred, glorifies violence and promotes a vile ideology." ⁵²

Most notably it would appear that all the arrests, charges and convictions in connection with *National Action* at that time were limited to the 'low hanging fruit' (including after the Home Office banning order) – they <u>did not</u> included actions against the people who have been involved in the creation, ideological propaganda, financing, strategy, or overall operations within (or connected to) that organization.

In August 2018 BBC TV published a documentary titled 'The Rise of the Extreme Far-Right in Britain'. ⁵³ That documentary featured (prominently, and yet again) the past rise, and activities of the *National Action* group, within the UK. Contributors to that documentary included former head of UK Counter Terrorism, Sir Mark ROWLEY and Hope Not Hate 'Head of Intelligence' Matthew COLLINS.

The documentary included an old video of a *National Action* 'march' in which approximately sixteen young men, masked, dressed in black, performing Nazi salutes, were escorted through an English town by a large contingent of police officers. It was a highly theatrical performance by all those involved.

Unfortunately it gave every indication of being a 'staged' event (with the active collaboration of the police).

Therefore, a matter that beggared belief was the extraordinary reluctance (at that time) of the UK State to pursue the arrest and prosecution of those who had been behind such outrageous activities.

The Independent Newspaper later claimed that Benjamin RAYMOND remained in touch with *National Action* members after the Home Office banning order, and that he had allegedly advised them on a post-banning operational strategy. His behaviour – including in Court during the trials of *National Action* members – strongly suggests he must have believed (at that time) that he would be exempt from any prosecutorial/judicial sanction by the UK State. ⁵⁴

On the 12th March 2018 VICE (UK) published two articles, both by James POULTER – one being an exposition on the neo-Nazi IronMarch.org forum and its links to terrorism, and the other connecting the Generation Identity movement to the promulgation of (white) racism. ⁵⁵

Later events (i.e. from late 2019 onwards) have been especially revealing. This includes the extraordinary 'leaking' of the *IronMarch.org* data files in November 2019, and the attempt to both disconnect Benjamin RAYMOND from the creation of that forum, and instead to connect it to Russia and to the Russian State – as expounded by organizations such as PROPORNOT and BELLINGCAT. In December 2019 the organization Bellingcat opined that the "recruiting through the US military" "It [IronMarch.org] went on to develop a small but lethal 'accelerationist' terror group called Atomwaffen Division Responsible for murders, an assassination attempt, and failed bomb plots." ⁵⁶ Given the context (of other contributions from Bellingcat, and from others) this was clearly intended to connect such actions to 'The Russians'.

On the 30th January 2020 the BBC published a Russian-language article titled 'Half Russian: The Story of Muscovite Alisher MUKHITDINOV and His Global Fascist Network'. ⁵⁷ The BBC claim that Alexander SLAVROS was a person named Alisher MUKHITDINOV and that he had created, and had been running, the Iron March forum. That claim was based on no evidence, whatsoever. ⁵⁸

It was mere baseless conjecture. However the response of Benjamin RAYMOND was that of pure glee – remarking "As long as everyone had fun, that's what counts". ⁵⁹ And of course he said nothing to correct the BBC's main thesis concerning the creator and operator of IronMarch.org.

Benjamin RAYMOND continued leading the neo-Nazi National Action, despite it being designated a terrorist organization by the UK Government. And he did so, for more than 4 years. The UK Government knew what he was doing, and RAYMOND undoubtedly knew they knew.

Clearly Benjamin RAYMOND believed he was 'untouchable'. So, what special privileges did he believe he had, such that he could act in that way with such impunity? He tried to use his IronMarch.org forum as a means for establishing a substantial neo-Nazi presence within Russia. Obviously the UK Government would have had access to his IronMarch.org forum (not least, by the simple expediency of inserting its own operatives as forum members). It would have known.


Finally, this report has an especially important relevance in regard to contemporary events (at the time of first issue completion, August 2024): the protests by English people in regard to an imposed government policy of mass immigration and the violence originating from within that immigrant-heritage population targeted against native English people; and of the likelihood of UK State agencies using bogus 'far right' groups, and individuals, to discredit and demonize those English protestors.




2011: Benjamin RAYMOND's Creation Of The 'Iron March' Online Forum








2011: Benjamin RAYMOND (aka 'NOYLES') Cites The Jewish Journal



Benjamin RAYMOND appears to have used a photo (above) from his own research archives. This was in place of the photo of St. Andrews University used in the Jewish Journal source article.




2014: The Key Purpose of National Action is Inadvertently Revealed






